



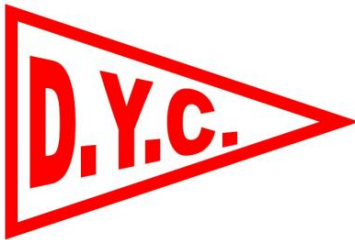

## Reminder to Members ...

### Bylaws

#### Section 6

Unauthorized non-members will not be allowed on Club property unless accompanied by a Member. Each Member will be allowed guest privileges in accordance with conditions specified by the Board and with the legislative statutes of the Province of Ontario.

Further, under

#### Eligibility to Use Docks:

16. Applications must specify the names of any non-family who are Co-owners or co-users of the boat, all of who must be DYC members. Any change in ownership requires a new Application.
26. .... Running on the docks is prohibited.

We are just trying to look out for the safety of everyone and their property.

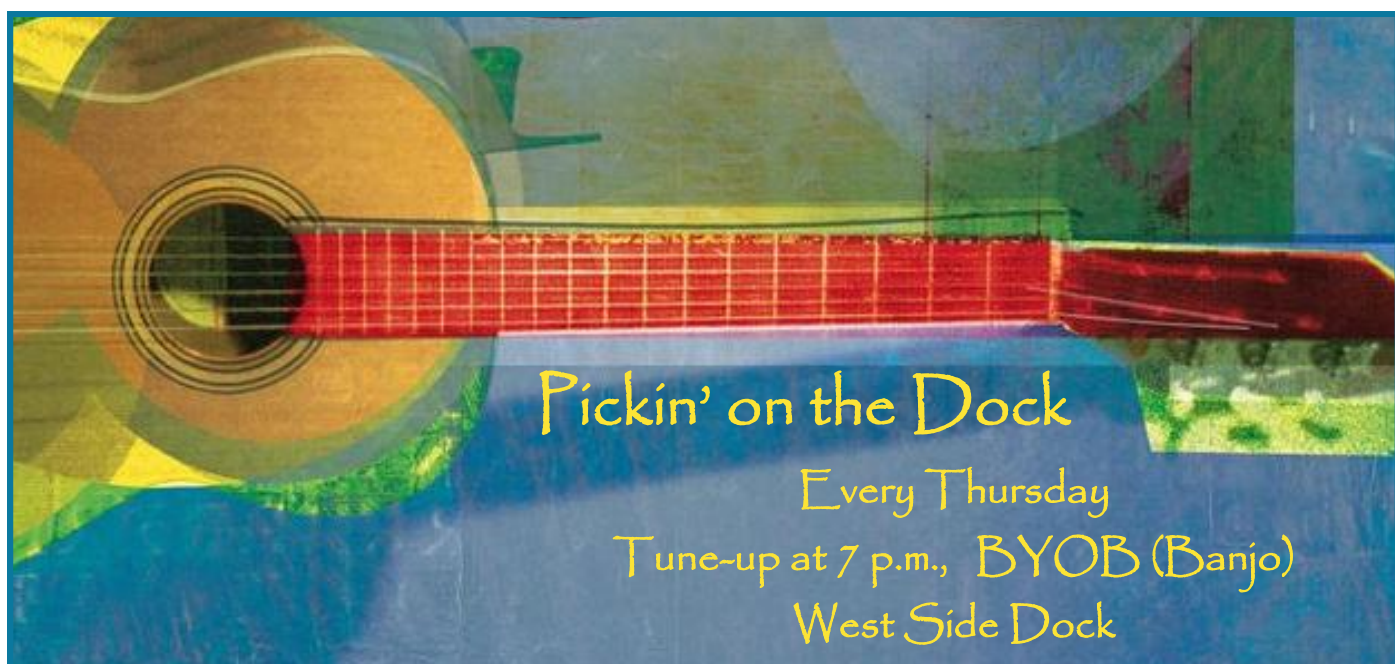


### Sail Past - Set for September 23.... "Sailing Has Past"

## May Day , May Day , May Day...

Those were the words we heard on VHF 16 after the very distinctive siren from the radio.

I am sure many of you have heard that call. For the first time in our boating life, we were caught up in the event. It was on the second day of our summer cruise on *Black Magic*. We had left Coburg in the morning, on our way east to Picton, our destination for the evening. The sky was clear and blue and the lake was nearly flat when we heard the call from the Coast Guard. A trawler, with two people on board, was about 5 nautical miles from Coburg with smoke coming from the engine room. The call was for anyone in the vicinity to give assistance to the vessel in distress.

Margaret and I looked at each other thought about what those two people would be going through. As I changed heading, back to Coburg, I called the Coast Guard to report our intention to assist and that we were about 5 miles out of Coburg. As we were a power boat we could be there in 15 minutes. We asked them to repeat the lat. long. position of the boat in distress.

Have you ever tried to pin-point a location from the babble of the Coast Guard? We got them to repeat it a few more times. At the same time, two sailboats just off Coburg replied they would give assistance and also asked for a repeat of the location off Coburg. I reported that we

had a good view of the lake but could see no smoke, nor the flare the trawler had fired.

Sure of the location, after several repeats, we entered it in the GPS and were surprised that the target was 35 nautical miles away! Concerned and totally confused, we radioed the Coast Guard, again.

A new voice, speaking clearly, repeated the coordinates slowly and said they had a vessel assisting from **Colborne**. I realize that we could have misheard the name once or twice, but two other vessels heard the same thing! (Perhaps the vessel in distress was not clear with the Coast Guard? Or, in the excitement of the moment perhaps the Coast Guard got it wrong?). I hope, if we ever need help, the message is relayed carefully. It must be very frightening to be waiting on a burning boat.

Eventually, the people on board the trawler were picked up in their dinghy. Their boat was towed in when it was safe. We were relieved they were safe. In the end, that's what is important. We should all remember, if we get into that situation, how crucially important good communication is.

If we hear a call again, we will respond to assist if we were nearby and ask questions as we head to the emergency. I am sure you would do the same!
