In any event, dock repairs are pretty much complete and boats are in the water and blessed. A few new dock assignments as well as some re-assignments have taken place with everything now largely in place for summer 2016. If there appear to be problems on your dock or near it, please let John Brown or me know about it. We are not constantly inspecting the docks.



For the benefit of new members and others, dock assignments are done on the following basis per information in the Club's "Dock/Dry Hoist/Launch Ramp Application":

The initial docks allocation is to members in good standing who submitted applications before February 28th. Remaining vacant docks will be assigned, in a secondary round of docks allocation. Docks shall be assigned by the Dock Chair for the benefit of all members and in the best interests of the Club. A member shall normally have first option to use a dock that was assigned for the previous season, but is not guaranteed that dock. Docks not assigned in the initial allocation will be offered to members, on the basis of fit, best interest of the club, special needs, and dock points.

#### History Matters ...

Three new plaques profile the successive first locks of the three Welland canals which transited Port Dalhousie. The plaques were conceived by the Port Dalhousie Beautification group. Mark Kennedy, a DYC member, organized their creation, working with the city of St. Catharines heritage department, who financed the project. Nancy Cameron, president of the Historical Society of St. Catharines, researched and wrote the content, and supplied pictures for all three signs.



Mark and partner Gwen are also the organizers of this year's Easter Seal event at DYC. Gwen has an event organizing company called Details Event Coordination. Mark races with Bjorn on Mariah. He is generally considered to be the pre-eminent member of the crew.


