


Treasurer's Report ...

Another sailing year has passed. It was by most accounts a pretty good season. Pam and I had hoped to sail to the Thousand Islands this year but we had a late start due to damage late last year, from a boulder off the Leslie Street Spit. Still we did enjoy good times over the summer, aboard Seascape, right here at DYC.

Fiscal 2016 was closed at the AGM in October. All in all, the year turned out to be pretty decent. For the third year we added \$20,000 to the capital reserve fund. The big negative was the growth in member accounts receivables -- ah, but that creates an opportunity right? There was a really good discussion at the AGM regarding the club fi-



nances. Specific reminders to the board included cautions that the capital reserve fund was strictly for dock replacement and that any other possible spending required membership approval.

My focus this coming year is on cash flow and value for money. The club has investigated banking options and, in November, the board approved a transfer of banking to Meridian Credit Union. DYC will enjoy lower account costs and earn interest on funds on deposit. Once the transition is complete, we will begin investigating more convenient and flexible options for members to pay dues. Currently, members have the burden of periodic dues and boating fees. DYC is looking at options to spread these payments out over quarterly or monthly cycles. We will likely phase in these options so I would really appreciate hearing from members who would like to be part of the testing group. Please let me know!

During the AGM, Richard Baker offered his assistance in digging into the club cost structures to help find areas of potential savings. I appreciate his offer and would like to add one or two others and form an ongoing finance committee. So please, if you have an interest in monitoring our costs, please let me know.

Finally, the new DYC board has met and begun to work. I want to acknowledge both the retiring members and welcome the new energy from incoming members. I hope all members recognize their contributions to the club's wellbeing.

Commodore Haynes welcomed all new members to the Board as well as those returning for a second year at old or new positions. All expressed satisfaction with their appointed roles.

1. Minutes from previous meeting were reviewed:

- Motion to approve October 20, 2016 Minutes was made by Don H., second by Richard N.
- 2. Commodore Report -- Paul gave a brief description of the Action Item concept for the benefit of new members after which we reviewed items from our last meeting.
 - Our Soling was chartered to a Brazilian for \$2500 who placed 2nd in the World Soling Regatta held in Kingston this year. Some other chartered boats did not pass measurement inspections while ours obviously did. A feather in DYC's cap.

3. Secretary Report

- This year's AGM was attended by approximately 30 members. Not a great turn out but typical of recent years.
- A slight change in the agenda was that instead of the secretary reading the previous year's minutes, they had been sent by email to all members. At the meeting, we simply opened the floor for questions. There being none, the minutes were approved. This saved considerable time.
- Richard pointed out that there were a number of questions and concerns raised during the discussion period. This prompted a discussion as to how to deal with members concerns and suggestions:
 - It might be timely to do another membership survey to determine "hot potatoes." Survey

- Monkey is a simple to use software that could help develop the survey.
- Printed copies of the Breeze should be made available at the Club for members who are not comfortable using internet.
- Comment cards should be made available at several locations around DYC.

4. Vice Commodore Report

- Club boats were not hauled out in a timely fashion. When they were, the water had been turned off so the bottoms could not be power washed.
- The Whaler's hydraulic fluid was empty.
- Next year, Club boats should be hauled immediately after Kirbys out.
- Club boats have been sent to Marlin for winterizing.
- 5. Rear Commodore Report –Simon welcomed new members to the Board
 - Meeting has been held with himself, Jason and John to get our Club boats in compliance with Industry Canada's "Small Vessel Compliance" requirements.

6. Treasurer Report

 Motion to move our banking to MCU by Richard. Second by Kevin.

Discussion

- Ted pointed out that previously we had over draught protection of ~\$35,000 with a line of credit at CIBC. Richard responded explaining what MCU offers.
- Rossco wondered why we don't have the dock fund in a separate bank account. Richard will investigate to see if 3/4% interest is available in a separate account.





Board Meeting, November 17, 2016 cont'd ...

6. Treasurer Report, cont'd

- Paul explained, for the benefit of new Board members, that a dock fund/capital development fund (CDF) was established to pay for the new B Dock. We have continued charging members this fee with the proviso that the funds will only be used to improve/replace dock.
- Motion carried.

7. Manager Report

- No new members this period.
- Tidying up of yard pretty much done. Needed to clear things away from Harbour Office for DFO work on sheet piles.
- Number of boats in storage down a little but got some bigger boats from other locations because of low water.

8. Dock Report

- Jeff getting up to speed on responsibilities, etc.
 Tom and Jeff will discuss and arrange a Dock
 Committee meeting in the near future.
- Encouraging a greater sense of community at DYC would be beneficial, e.g. being a Club member has benefits over and above having a place to park your boat.

9. Membership and Communication Report

- Some fresh thoughts on increasing membership are by as much as 30 50.
 - have program to introduce women to sailing using member boats, Thursday nights perhaps, get help from Wendy, Deb, others
 - advice on what to wear, offer sailing experience.
- Offer summer storage to jet skis, fishing boats, paddle boats, etc.
- Discussion on volunteer/Club Hours.

10. Fleet and Infrastructure

- Club boat maintenance will be a high priority in 2017.
- Little Whaler should have a motor. It is a good working boat for docks in and garbage pickup.
 Also seems a waste of a perfectly good boat to not have it in service.

- Avon has been sent to Marlin for service.
- Rossco has an idea to save us money by reducing costs of A/C energy use.

11. Entertainment Report – Tom L. participated through skype from California.

- Create a Club event for watching America's Cup in May/June.
- Get information regarding our website operation and try to improve it.
- Meet with Deb to determine best events moving forward through 2017.
- Fun, fund raising events??

12. Yard Report

- Consideration is being given to purchasing a small crane suitable for hauling docks, trailered boats, mast stepping, etc. Dock Committee needs to be informed/involved.
- Dinghy Hoist-can repairs be rolled into DFO wall repair? Does crane purchase impact the need?

13. House Report

- We need to take a close look at energy use/waste.
 - Switch to LED's. Everywhere?
 - Additional fee for boats using A/C.

14. Learn to Sail Report

- Jason would like us to have a vibrant adult learn to sail program.
- Working on Transport Canada compliance.

15. Food and Beverage

- Not aware of any complaints.
- Restaurateurs are pleased.

16. New Business

Jason suggested we have a "Fundraiser Chair."
 There is money available to pay student employees – could help John B. It takes time to fill out forms and questionnaires, e.g. Trillium.

Motion to adjourn by Richard, second by Jason– Carried Adjourned 10:28 pm.






DYC Cruising Ambassadors of 2016 ...


