Commodore's Report . . .

September! schools are back and Covid-19 is still a worry. Leigh has sent out the Haul-out notices so the 2021 boating season is waning. Still DYC is a blur of activity. We have LOSHRS races in mid-September. Overall, the club is looking great. This is a tribute to Jeff, Dan and our seasonal staff.

August 31st, was DYC's fiscal year end. Time to start work on the Annual General Meeting. With a bit of luck, we'll be able to hold it in person. More likely it will be a hybrid meeting - some in attendance and others on line. Jim White is leading an effort to fill board positions. For new members, there are also opportunities to join in work parties and committees to help ensure DYC continues to improve its operations and appearance. Meanwhile I'm wrapping up my 2-year term as Commodore. It's been quite the two years with many changes, challenges, a few missteps, not to mention Covid-19. I am content to step aside and have the new board take charge at the upcoming AGM.

A new member initiation fee has been implemented as of September 1st. This is to acknowledge that new members are buying into the valuable DYC institution. This value is due to the work, by completed, or paid for by current and previous members. Club investments such as the travel lift, dock, new clubhouse roof and air conditioning are all evidence of a dynamic club.

As DYC grows to full dock capacity, a key club priority is to formalize the member work programme. The 80/20 rule is not going to work effectively going forward and DYC needs to establish a better system to acknowledge the member workers who have been contributing "above and beyond", and to raise the awareness among members-at-large of the benefits to participating in keeping DYC looking great, having great equipment and systems. I have asked Patti-jo Chambers to lead this initiative.

Ontario has now proclaimed the New "Not-For-Profit" corporations. DYC now has 3 years to update its Constitution, by-laws and policies. We have had a committee consisting of; Dan Sundy, John Dickhout, Jim White and me. We have been plowing through the existing governance documents and bringing them into compliance with the new legislation. I expect that next year's AGM (November 2022) will give members an opportunity to review and consider our work.

Back to haul-out & winter storage. This is DYC's first year to haul-out over several days. Please remember that DYC is saving \$30,000+ /year in external costs by using the travel lift. Some portion of these savings are transferred to internal costs. (Eg. Staffing & equipment maintenance). However extra planning is required to organize timings for both haul-out and launch. Using the principle "we cannot please all the people all the time" please cooperate with the dock crew committee who are working on your behalf. Best wishes for the remaining weeks of boating.

Safety Officer's Report . . .

Busy, busy, busy this summer and I don't mean me. Been out five, maybe six times and three were just for a swim. The re-opening of the piers, the lifting of some restrictions under COVID and warm summer winds have made Pt Dal Harbour more like Yonge and Bloor than Lakeshore and Lighthouse. Global swarming?

Am I crazy or are there more jet skis (and skiers) out and about this year than previous ones? And from what I've seen, perhaps I should re-word that previous sentence. Most are compliant and safe in the operation of their craft, but something is going on out there and we've all seen it. I remember a time... Wait. I've forgotten. Again! When you see something unsafe to you, take the necessary action, such as slowing turning and signaling. Do jet skis have marine radios? Paul?

Rule number one of boating is that the skipper is in charge of the operation and safety of the craft and its inhabitants. So do your part by following the rules regarding right of way, keeping a slow speed in the Dock Area/Harbour and by respecting boaters who are fishing, kayakers/canoers/board riders and especially anchored boats with swimmers in the water. It could be you (or me). And stay outside the marked areas.

As you have no doubt noticed, planning is underway for boats-out. Not something you really want to consider at this time of year, but hey...planning is not doing. There are definitely changes coming to the way things are going to be done compared to past years when the crane showed up and it was all over by noon (as if!). From what I have read, each of us 'should' bring a minimum of two persons to assist with the setup of cradles and stands, handling of lines and so on. Familiarity does more than just breed contempt; it makes things go more easily and thus reduces stress. So do your best to be ready on your day. More to follow for sure.

Darkness is setting in earlier. So, a reminder to turn on your lights at dusk. Believe it or not, it helps. Especially in Court.

Get back out there and have some fun. *Larry*

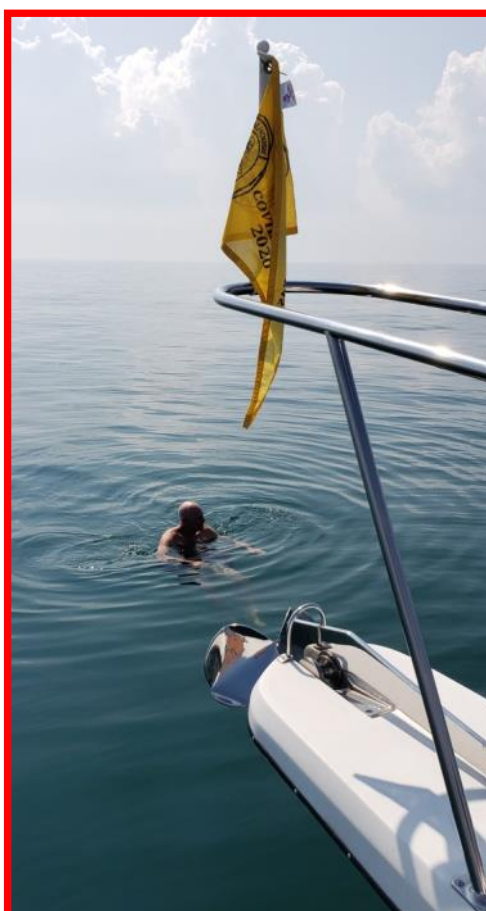
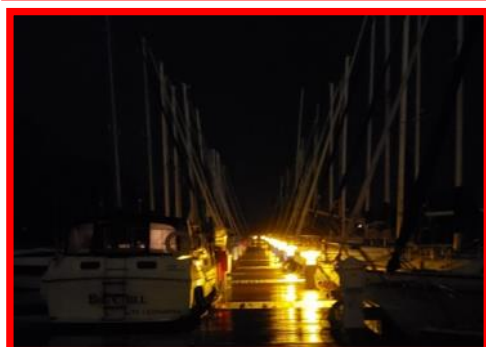

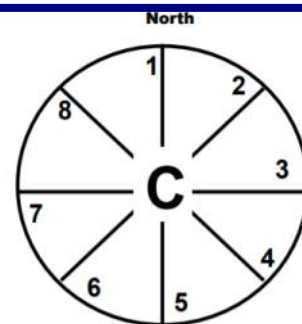

Docks & Digital Report . . .

Good Day DYC Boaters,

It saddens me to send this out but... its time to start thinking about Hauling Out and wrapping up another great boating season. Don't get me wrong, there's still 1+ months of great times to be had on the lake, but we do need you to let us know what your winter storage plans are.

We will be using our new travel lift to hauling out for the first time and so for everyone this will be new / different than years previous. Please complete the [Haul Out and Storage Application](#) form and let us know if you would like to be hauled out **earlier** than October 10th, **between** October 11th and 24th or **Later** then October 24th. If you chose early then you will be splashed later in the spring, and so the reverse applies for those who chose a later haul out, you will need to be ready to splash earlier in spring. So choose wisely.

We do have limited space in our yards and expect to fill them so please complete your form sooner than later. **New this year, either a deposit of \$500 or payment in full** is required to hold your place in the yard. We will be opening the storage registration to non DYC members in the second week of September as there have been inquires already.

Again because we have so many new members and even for those seasoned, this is a new process for all of us. Here are some things to consider for Haul out.

- 1) What kind of cradle do I have (Steel Fixed, Steel Knock Down, Jacks and Blocks, Trailer) You must have one of these labels in our yard as soon as possible, if you don't please let us know what your plan is to acquire one.
- 2) You must leave 4 fenders and 4 lines long enough to pass to your support team you bring on the day of your haul out. You should have at a minimum yourself and 2 others available to help you haul your boat out.
- 3) Make sure your sling marks are clearly identified. Mark them with tap on the top of your deck so that the lift team can clearly see where to set the straps.

Most Importantly be ready the day before your lift day, and come early the day of your lift. We are a self help club for the majority and this is one of the key activities where you get to work with your fellow members and support one and other. Plan to volunteer for the day of your lift and don't hesitate to volunteer to help on other days as well.

We will be having a virtual Haul Out information night on the 9th of September, from 7 - 8 p.m. to provide further details on what you can expect for your lift and how to prepare your boat for it.

Ok so please complete your applications and then enjoy the rest of the season.

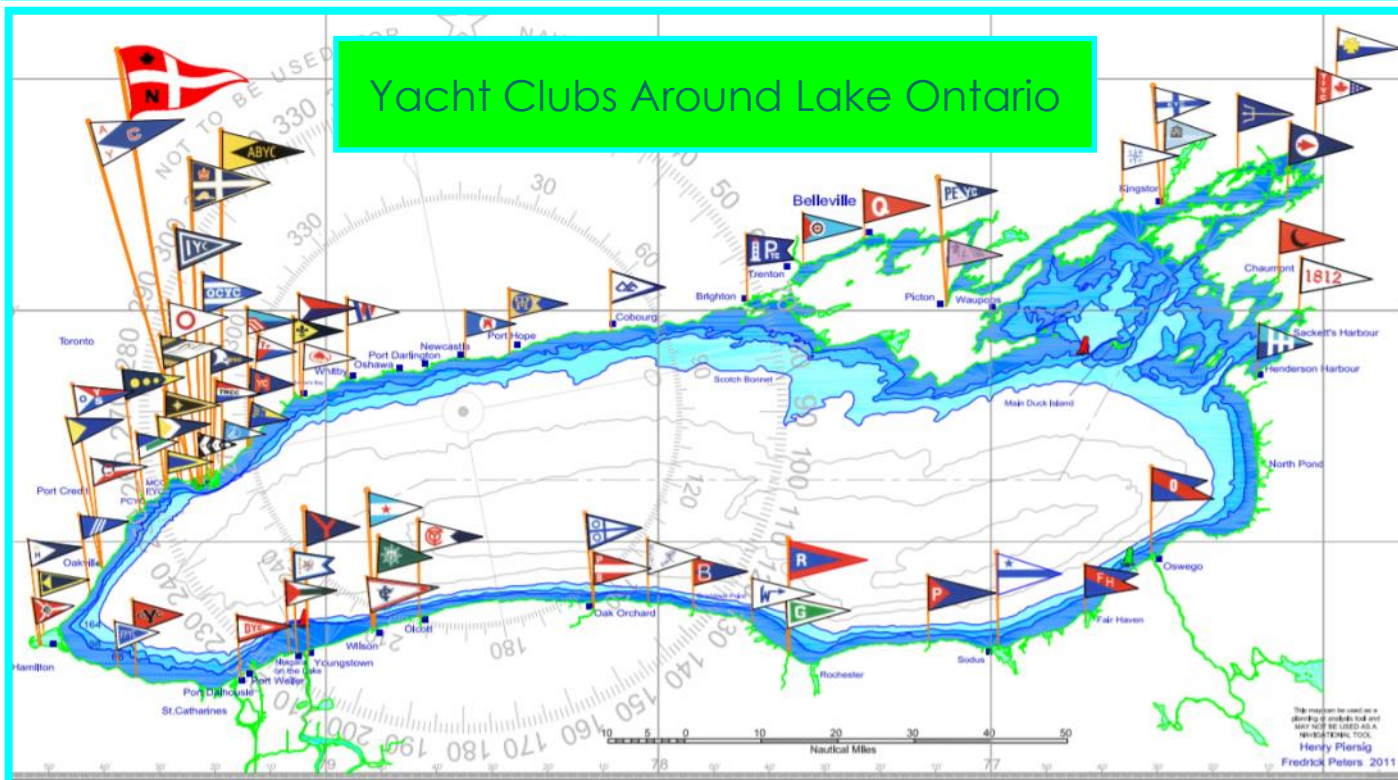

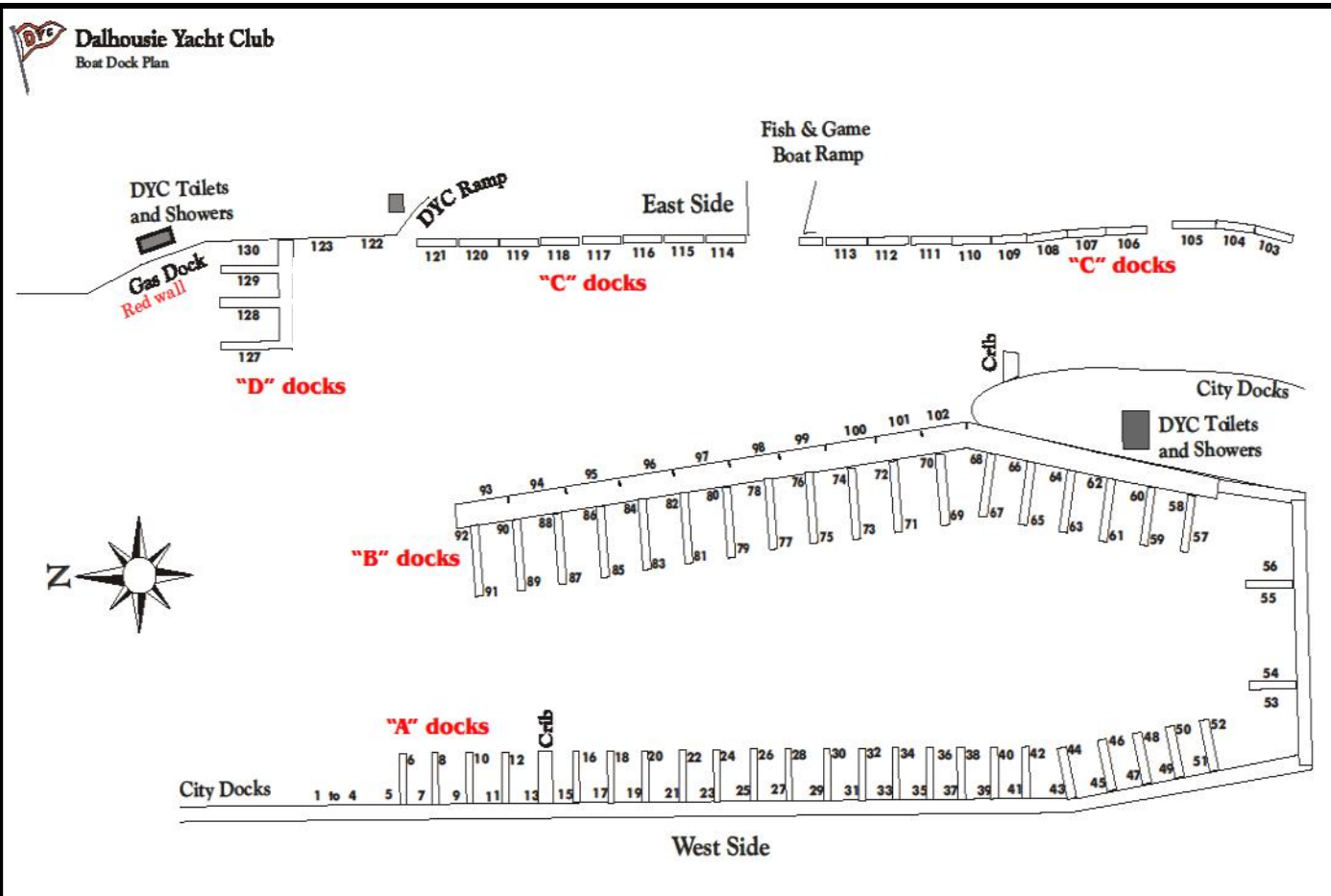
