Commodore's Report . . .

The months are speeding by and September will be upon us all too soon. Meanwhile we are all surrounded by conflicting news on Covid-19. On one hand, Niagara is now in Phase III – which means more access to services and, on

the other hand, rates of infection are rising. Second wave? or will we need to reverse course? Who knows?

Maximum caution is the watch word, masks are becoming de rigueur and a fashion statement and are a key defence against being infected. From what we've all read, avoiding the risk of infection must be a top priority for each of us. Remind yourself and others. Do not relax your guard. Stay safe.

As mentioned in my recent member update, the due date for membership fees has changed to January 31 st . For full boating members, there will be an opportunity to add the dock deposit to the payment.

DYC's fiscal year-end is August 31, 2020, In September and October, we'll be preparing for the Annual Year-End report to members. In normal times DYC holds its AGM in late October, this year the AGM will most likely be a virtual meeting. I suspect this will be a first-time experience. However, the Board has been meeting virtually every month so we have some experience albeit on a smaller scale. We'll keep everyone posted.

The Board of Directors has the responsibility and authority to set membership and auxiliary fees for the upcoming year. Please remember that last year, the Board made the decision to hold fees at 2019 levels. This was to somewhat offset members' inconveniences due to pier reconstruction, and condo construction.

This year, to ensure that DYC continues to be strong, maintains its infrastructure and its reserve funds, the Board made the decision to increase membership and storage fees by 2.5%. These changes are effective September 1, 2020. This equates to a 1.25% per year average increase over the past 2 years.

Restaurant minimums have been a continuing administrative challenge for both the Club and the restaurant. Edward and Emily believe, and we agree, that members will continue to support the restaurant with or without minimums. To that end, we are pleased to advise that the restaurant minimums policy is being suspended for a one-year trial period beginning September 1, 2020. This decision will be re-evaluated prior to August 2021, and may be reversed if members have not adequately patronized the restaurant. The restaurant is an integral part of the success of DYC and the Board is looking forward to your continued support.

If you look at what DYC has achieved this year despite high water, Covid-19, and the pier reconstruction, I think you'll feel as I do, that DYC is a dynamic and forward-looking club. For those of you able to get away cruising or otherwise – Safe Travels

Harbour Office Report...

Hello members,

I am pleased to advise that DYC has now passed all the necessary requirements to become a certified **ValvTect Marine Fuel Dealer**. To most of us this may not mean much because ValvTect has only recently become available in Canada. In the U.S., however, this special blend fuel is quite well known by most boaters who will regularly seek out the product whenever available.

Largely, this change is being brought about because regular gasoline is no longer available in this area without having an ethanol blend. In addition, our competition has already made the change to ValvTect.

I'm sure most of us are aware of the damaging effects ethanol can cause to marine gas engines. ValvTect is specially formulated to prevent problems like phase separation, fuel stability and carbon deposit build up.

Safety Officer's Report . . . Safety is Personal

A recent incident while fueling a powerboat at Bridgeport Marina in Orillia in which a serious and potentially disastrous fire broke out made it onto the Boating Industry Canada website http://boatingindustry.ca/featured-articles/8142-explosion-and-boat-fire-at-the-dock-what-would-you-do?

<u>utm_source=newsletter&utm_medium=email&utm_content=4831422&utm_campaign</u> = - EXPLOSION AND BOAT FIRE AT THE DOCK – WHAT WOULD YOU DO? caught my attention (actually I was pointed to it by a safety-conscious DYC member).

It caused me to go over what I would do if such a thing as described happened while I was near the fueling dock. Well, that was interesting but irrelevant, since I am seldom there. So I thought about what would those there - such as our summer employees and office staff – do in such a case. And what resources are available for them? And how long would it take first 911 responders to get there?

Well, when the fire extinguishers are exhausted (one to two minutes), our people would have to withdraw to safety after maybe, if it made sense, sending the boat off into the channel. The first responders? Ten to fifteen minutes from Linwell Road, I'd guess. A lot can happen in ten minutes. A lot.

So. Prevention is the first step.

How many working fire extinguishers do you have on your boat? At least two I hope. How close to the most likely fire start-point are they? Not so close you can't get at them in an emergency situation, I hope. And does everyone on-board know where they are and how to use them?

Well. Compliance with DYC directions for refueling aids in prevention. They are posted on the outside walls of the Harbour Office for all to see, read and digest. Here they are (edited by me):

Moor the boat securely to prevent spills, (your job)

Shut off all engines, (your job)

Extinguish all open flames, (your job)

No smokina, (your job)

Turn off all electrical switches, radios, and power sources on board, (your job)

Close up ports, and hatches, (your job)

Remove portable tanks from the vessel before refueling, (your job)

All persons get off boat except fuel attendant, (your job)

Prevent fuel spills into the boat's hull and the water. To this end, know tank capacity and do not overfill, (Staff job to enquire and act accordingly)



Safety Officer's Report Cont'd

Ground the nozzle against the filler pipe, (Staff job)

Wipe up spills and dispose of the used cloth or towel in an approved container, (Staff job)

Run the engine compartment blower for at least four minutes immediately before starting the gasoline engine, (your job)

Check for fuel vapours from the engine compartment before starting the engine, (your job)

Staff may (will) remind you to do some of these essential actions if missed. Take it as helpful advice. In the end it is your job to do it. Point made?



Addressed Rotarians



Walter Bell and Jules Dugas, St. Catharines men who yesterday told the Rotary Club of their experiences in a year's cruise from Port Dalhousie to the South Seas. The two were away exactly one year in their 20 foot yacht, constructed in Bell's backyard, and had many interesting experiences, including near tragedy in sudden squalls. The pair were introduced by Tom Welsh, who met them in Miami. At the meeting five new members were introduced: Wm. Kerr, Wm. Walkins, Alex McPhail, Ted Walker and Tom Cook. Lance Dunn presented the guests, who received a welcome from past president Arch Mix. President E. F. Palmer. occupied the chair.

Jules Dugas was a long time member at DYC. He is mentioned as participating in the meetings to form the club in December 1936.

Walter Bell was probably an early member as his boat is shown in the Standard's coverage of the opening of DYC in 1937.

There are no, club produced, records from 1937 to 1945.

Information of this era comes from personal diaries or newspaper coverage. In 1945 meeting minutes were instituted as it was a requirement of the incorporation process. The earliest roster in our archives is from 1966.



It has been brought to my attention that some of the gates have been left unlocked over


west wall gates!




