Harbour Office hours will remain as they have this season.

After Labour Day, Monday, September 7th ~ the Harbour office will be staffed only on Saturday and Sunday from 10:00 to 6:00. During the week, Fueling and Pump outs can be arranged by calling me at 905-988-3089 between 09:00 and 5:00P.M. The phone information and hours will be posted on the fuel pump and Harbour Office door.

Also, I recently contacted our ValvTect representative to inquire about off season fuel storage for our boats. I was pleased to learn that if the boat's fuel tank contains 100% ValvTect, then no additional fuel additive is needed to keep either gas or diesel over the winter season. ValvTect gasoline stabilizes for one year or more, while ValvTect for diesel remains stable for 2 years or more.

Safety Officer's Report . . . Safety is Personal

It was suddenly a dark and stormy night. Thunder crashed all around. Lightning strikes on the water were so close there was no sound delay - just a massive flash and bang. Winds were at dangerous levels – 35 knots (for a CS-30) and 65 knots (for an Alberg 30) pushing the lake waves to three meter (12 feet) height as the storm front (visible at https://weather.gc.ca/radar/index_e.html?id=WKR) passed through. The crew (all family), were all sick and Mom, dangling from the cabin roof-mounted hand rails and walking precariously on the cabin walls was struggling forward to the head to get the Gravol (generic brands are available and effective too) and several glasses of water. Fortunately everyone was wearing their PFDs and rain gear.

Suddenly, the port-side mast stays, weakened by years of neglect tore from the chain plates, the mast falling over the side. Not gone, it and the sails were being pulled along by the remaining stays; something that was in fact beneficial as it acted as a sea anchor, slowing the boat. Eh? Maybe.

The skipper decided it was time to call into the Coast Guard and get some help, but the radio audio was just static noise competing with the noise of wind and waves.

Oops. The mast-mounted radio antenna was gone. The spare was somewhere down below. And where was that connector he would need to join it to the radio antenna cable anyway?

Ok. Enough drama.

Does your radio work? Have you tested it lately by listening and transmitting (to your boat neighbors if no one else is available)? Well, you should. Do you monitor Channel 16 continuously as required? Well, you should. By the way, just because you can hear others on your radio does not mean that you can transmit successfully. For a beer, I will endlessly lecture you why this is so. It has to do with Z. (Keith's, please)

The Canadian Coast Guard website says re Distress Communications in Radiotelephony - "In the interest of ensuring the highest level of safety, mariners should immediately notify the Canadian Coast Guard, through any Marine Communications Traffic Services Centre of any situation which is or may be developing into a more serious situation requiring assistance from the Search and Rescue (SAR) System. The need for the earliest possible alerting of SAR Authorities to potential maritime emergencies cannot be overemphasized." This includes informing them of your location and situation before things get serious. They don't mind your call. They appreciate it, in fact.



Safety Officer's Report Cont'd

Because in an urgent situation this can be difficult, as was illustrated in the story above, if your radio is old, you may want to consider replacement with a newer model with the Digital Selective Calling (DSC) feature (read about it!). The radio can be linked via a simple cable (I wouldn't be surprised if it can now link with Bluetooth or some other such tech wizardry) to your GPS. In an emergency you flip up a red cover, hold the red button for a few seconds (as per the instruction manual) and your vessel identification and location are sent automatically to a CG listening station. Not much drama there.

I replaced my boat's old Marine Band VHF radio (transistors!!!) in 2010 with one I bought on sale at the Toronto Boat Show (does anyone remember Boat Shows?). It was surprisingly cheap.

And I test it every year, at least once.

It's up to you.

Very Local History Matters . . .

The most northerly lighthouse was built in 1878 for the 3rd canal. It is the current structure on the end of the east pier. The more southerly building was the lighthouse constructed at the end of the 2nd canal pier. (Piers were extended 300 feet for 3rd canal,) the two lighthouses gave a 300 feet light range. This picture is pre 1898 as in that year the southerly lighthouse burned, and was replaced with the current inner lighthouse on land by the marina. This increased the length of the light range from 300 feet (pre 1898) to 1500 feet.

The ship is the Lakeside.






