
Treasurer's Report ...

DYC BREEZE

Despite Covid-19 restrictions, the boating season has been relatively unaffected with the exception of the use of our



This additional revenue has increased our cash position to offset the club expenses, especially the cost of the Travel Lift and some infrastructure spending for the clubhouse and docks. We finished our financial year end in a slightly positive net revenue position of \$11,000 after accruing for the final payment of the travel lift, property lease and taxes. As a non-profit club, we managed the financial year well and maintained budget compliance.

There will be some continuing challenges with Covid surges that may have lingering effects on in-house dining and club events, but we will continue to manage in a financially responsible way providing continued membership value. Our annual budget review will examine expected cost increases as well as revenue changes to balance our financial position. The club continues to build its reserve fund to be able to participate in future capital expenditures such as A dock replacement and fleet refurbishment, in order to provide club improvements supporting membership value.



Paul & Francine Sakalauskas became New Full Boating Members, February 2021, in preparing for being on DYC docks this season. Then shortly after, disappointingly were told their boat would be delayed, as the manufacturer was behind in production.

We received this note from Francine, September 16. Great news this week!

Picking it up next spring! So excited. Francine & Paul








History Matters . . .


On the east pier, there has been a series of companies supplying coal to the canal and lake steamships.



"From whence we came . . ."




