



Commodore's Report

Greetings DYC members. With the month of June almost over, I can just start to see the light at the end of the tunnel. The school year is wrapping up, teaching assignments for next year are being sorted out, and I am feeling pretty excited about "taking the summer off" for the first time since I was 13-years-old.

What does this all mean? Well, scrubbing off the boat and getting her in the water sounds like a good idea. I miss the Wednesday night race scene and look forward to getting back on the line with some casual sailboat racing. After all the phone calls I made, I am still surprised that the water levels remain the same. I thought being the Commodore gave me some pull on the lake, but all joking aside, high waters continue to bring a lot of concerns and challenges. I was impressed how the entire membership stepped up and handled it, and I am extremely grateful that we got most of us in the water in a safe and thought out manner.

The St. Lawrence corridor is an important economic engine for Canada. It generates over 45 billion in business and almost a quarter million jobs. It is challenging for policy makers to bridge the control of outflow levels from Lake Ontario by pressing pause on a significant component of Canada's economy. At some point though, the International Joint Commission (IJC) might have to bite the bitter end and substantially increase outflows so that Lake Ontario can get ahead of the drainage projections before winter. High water levels and ice are a perfect storm for shoreline shareholders. I am remaining optimistic that greater heads will prevail, and mother nature will hopefully slow up her rate of precipitation in the region. **Climate change is real folks.** Paul Haynes always encourages me to keep my communications positive, so follow the IJC on Facebook and you will read a lot of different perspectives about why our water levels are so high.

In the meantime I must continue to throw my praises at the work of our membership to keep DYC the place to be, especially with the revival of fashionable rubber boots. Richard Nowina managing the helm of the Club in the absence of a successful hire; my appreciation for the return of Dave Bellhouse as he mans the pumps and keeps up with the yard from our harbour office; Dave Pressley is a beast with all the behind the scene work he does non-stop; Lew and Tracey working on hiring us a new office administrator; Wendy has almost a full time job coordinating all the projects with dock maintenance (without an iota of complaint --- thank goodness); Jim White keeping an additional eye on all the hubbub happening around our club; and thank you to all the spouses who let these members spend extra time away from cutting their lawns and folding the laundry. Hey, the list goes on.

I hope that everyone takes pause, and reads over the messages in the Breeze from all our members and recognizes the hard work that everyone is putting in to save us money, to keep our operation running smartly during these trying times, and to make DYC the fun and social place it truly is.



Vice Commodore's Report ...

Organizational sustainability

In 2019, DYC has been buffeted by two major incidents. The second -the return of high waters has been handled and managed quite well. Partly this was due to what we learned in 2017: we were better prepared to react early. Equally important, members showed both acceptance and a "what can we do to mitigate the situation" attitude. There was no complaining, just team building to defend against flood damages. And if, as predicted, high waters will be a factor for some years to come DYC will be better prepared.



We may buy water bladders to deploy in lieu of sandbags, install permanent sump pumps and transition to floating docks as old docks are replaced. Meanwhile stacks of dock risers may be a common sight.

The first incident — the departure of the former manager — has been a more fundamental learning experience for the club. Despite the fact that we all join DYC for the fun, the camaraderie, and the joy of being on the water, the fact is, that under the fun part is a cash flow business. DYC is a not-for-profit business. Business is the important description. We need to collect money, pay bills, attend to regulatory standards, hire staff, run payrolls and invest in resources to manage all these tasks responsibly. This is a communal responsibility. It's why we have a Board of Governors and why we call ourselves a self help club. We still have a way to go. We need to attract new members, and to get more members participating regularly so that more of us recognize the complexity of the club and its infrastructure.

For the past 6 months, DYC has called on its members to assist in managing, administering, organizing, and running the day to day affairs. Member response has been phenomenal. There's a new vitality; the IT systems are vastly improved; accounting is vastly improved; physical appearance is vastly improved. We have reintroduced Officer of the Day coverage to greet visiting boats and be the face of the club to visitors. The most recent example was the call for assistance to raise the LTS dock so the children could safely launch. Ask! And it's done. DYC members are energized.

"What can I do?", and "I see this situation - I'll fix it" are two common statements. Everyone of us can see the improvements. We can feel the energy. I believe the lesson for DYC is that members cannot delegate absolutely to hired staff. We need to maintain strong oversight, expect accountability from staff and the board, but expect to pitch in regularly. It's the only way to understand the complexity of running the business side of fun.

We have accomplished a lot and there's more to do. We have more "catching up" to do from a maintenance and appearance perspective we need to tackle broader challenges; attracting new members, strengthening relationships with the community, and encouraging young sailors through learn to sail.

All in all, DYC members can be proud of their role in revitalizing DYC. During the summer as we enjoy time on the water, let's dream a little more about what DYC could do to be even better.

History Matters ...



1978 lease from Fisheries and Oceans to DYC

Leases have extensive text description of boundaries with reference to lat and long coordinates, and survey stakes. There was also a sketch to represent the information visually. Our current leases have satellite images of our area with added lines super-imposed to denote the lease boundaries. Previous leases had extensive sketches with added lines to denote the boundaries.

The picture shows a part of our 1978 lease. Of interest is the representation of Lakeside park layout.

The lease drawing re-uses an older drawing, as the Lakeside park midway closed in 1969, and the dance pavilion burned in 1974. In addition, the former site of Henry's Boats (Henry Bernhard) was leased to DYC in 1972. This area became our "D" yard, which was subsequently returned in part to the city for the construction of the Waterfront Trail in 1996.



We are happy to announce that thanks to wonderful efforts from many club members, our Sailing School will start July 1, 2019 with great success.


This past weekend volunteers banded together to build a dock to increase the height of our current Sailing School dock. The dock is now above water level and the sailors can safely launch their boats.
