#### Corporate Seal



The new not for profit legislation for Ontario does not require a seal.

Image 1, is the product of the cylinder on the left. (The image has been flipped to show how the imprint would look on paper. The engraved image is reversed)

Image 2, is the product of the black machine on the right.

#### Safety Officer's Report . . . Safety is Personal

Safety Instructions for Novice Sailors (but not powerboaters)

(Some are from 'Sailing' Magazine, Oct 1964 found while cleaning out the garage, some are just common sense. Guess which is which.)

Behave responsibly at all times; you are being filmed. Yes. You are.

Point your beer can away from your face while opening it.

Never leave glass bottles on the deck, on the cockpit sole or in the scuppers. Neighbours will complain about 'the litter' and possibly the noise.

Never text instructions to the foredeck crew during a race. 'One hand for themselves; one hand for the ship' is the rule. Shouting is ok though.

Never sail off into the sun unless you are wearing sunglasses and minimum SPF 30 sun screen.

If sailing alone, make sure your safety harness is short enough to keep you on the boat; no sense dragging things out.

If sailing alone around the world, make sure your personal insurance is still valid when you are on the water.

Do not throw Port Dalhousie whitefish into the Port Dalhousie Yacht Club parking lot.

Do not swim in Port Dalhousie Harbour at night unless you are wearing the appropriate navigation lighting, carrying the required number of flares, wearing a bathing suit and are certifiably crazy.

Never yell at RCMP patrol boats moving down the Port Dalhousie Harbour, even if they are oblivious to other activities going on around them and are raising a wake that places others in danger. They can be 'twitchy'.

Yield right of way to freighters even if 'they are wrong'. Shaking your fist at them as they steam by 10 feet away is permitted. Shouting is useless (in this case).

Never drive your sailboat as if you had neutral and reverse gear.
