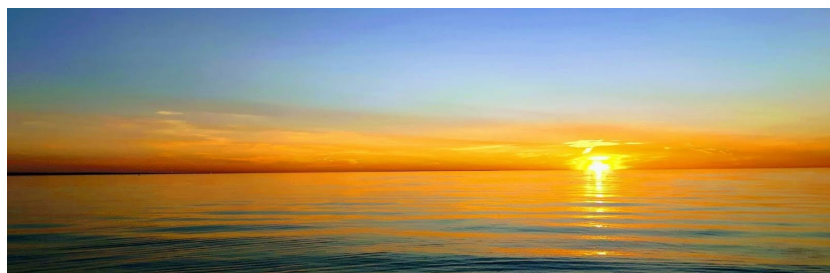

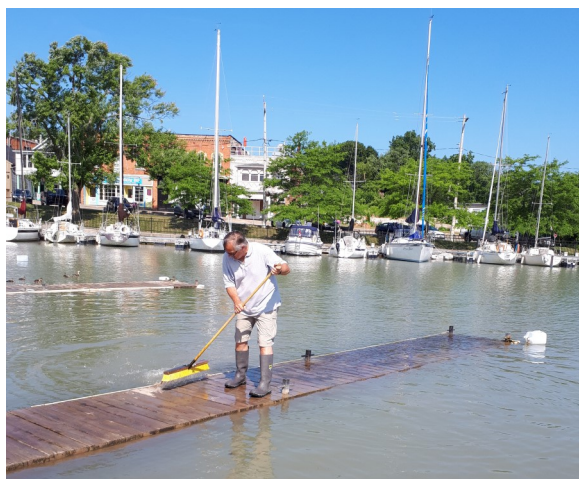

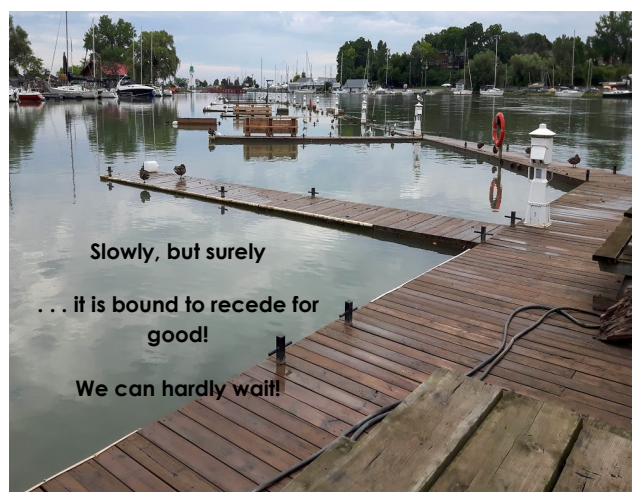

Be better... Do better

Last month I wrote about sustainability. Today I'm thinking about how we get there. For six months, as a club, we have been gaining momentum in developing systems, processes and policies to ensure a sustainable club. To my mind this means a club that is affordable, has strong competent administration, checks and balances in all its systems and an engaged membership.



In 2019, DYC has faced forces beyond our control. The chaos of pier reconstruction and condo development, higher and higher water levels, dock electrical shutdowns, and plumbing issues with the Harbour Building. By and large, the club has remained calm and focused on finding options and solutions to these external forces. Longer term, this strength augers well for the club. To get through all these difficulties, many stalwart members have devoted an extraordinary amount of personal time and skills to ensure we come out on top of the issues.

Two to three years from now we'll be sitting in a strong position. The piers will be done, condos well underway. Potential members will be lining up to join. The challenges are to get there. We are tackling some difficult issues and investing for a good future, all the while dealing with immediate difficulties. While progress may not be apparent to all, or fast enough for some, I believe we are heading in the right direction.

What are our successes to date? Well here are some examples. And these are the tip of the iceberg. We are more proactive, more planning is being done, policies are being developed, accounting procedures are much, much better, the Board has appointed Larry Richardson as the Safety Officer, the LTS programme is doing really well — happy students and strong coaches and the fleet in much better shape than previously. We are planning for cleanups and checking on electrical systems, so that we can re-power the docks as soon as it is safe to do so. Volunteers are continuing to volunteer. Best of all — boats are sailing again.

How do we get to where we need to be? We need members willing to pitch in, an ability to observe things that need attention, lots of discussion, assistance with tasks, patience and persistence.

Pam and I are getting away on Seascope in early August. Our first trip of the season. I hope everyone has an opportunity to relax and enjoy life.

Dock Chair Report ...

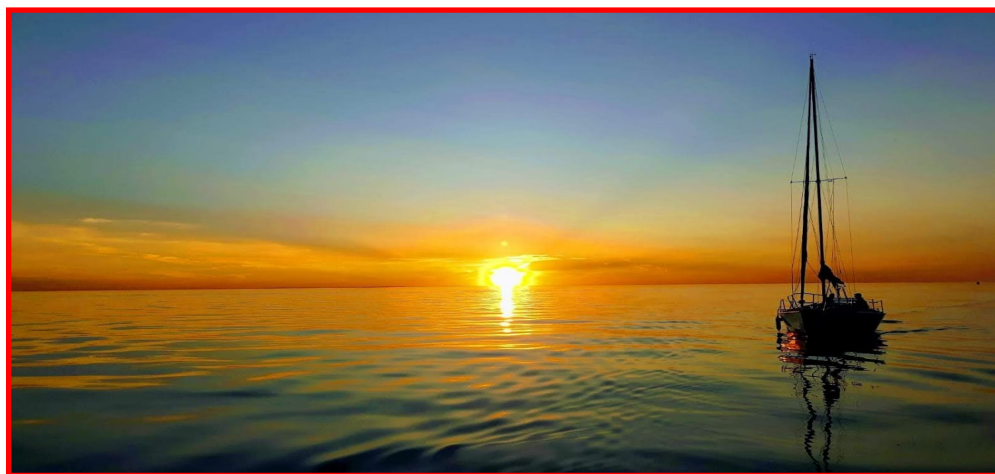

Oh my goodness!! High water woes continue. As of this writing, B dock remains unusable for normal dockage. I can only say I am so thankful for everyone's patience and cooperation. Each time I put out a request for help or a project, volunteers arrive.

Most recently a crew worked at scrubbing the still submerged B dock, to clear it if accumulated silt and algae growth. While working it was found that there were a number of loose and even missing dock boards. Anyone walking this dock must show great caution. Areas still water covered may be slippery. Be watchful for loose or missing boards. As the water subsides, B dock may start to be occupied. If you feel you are able to safely utilize your usual dock and no one is in it, you may relocate to it. Please confirm with me so I know which dock has been freed up with the move. Reclaiming our usual docks will be a sequential event. As one boat moves, that spot becomes available to its usual occupant.

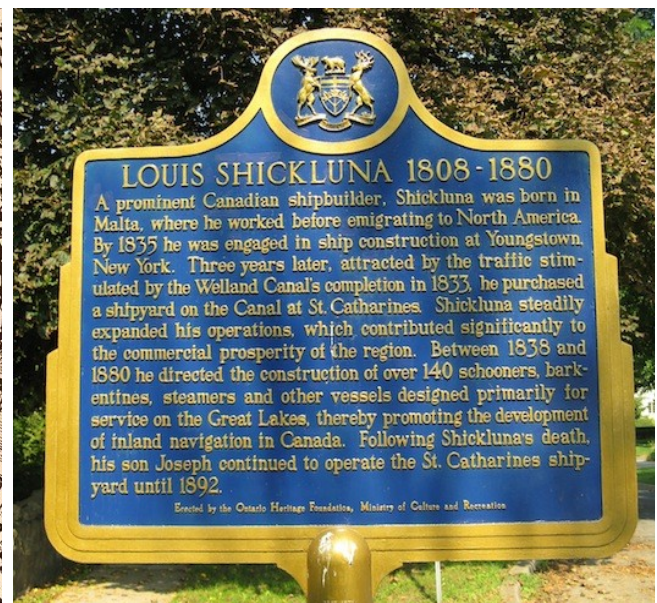
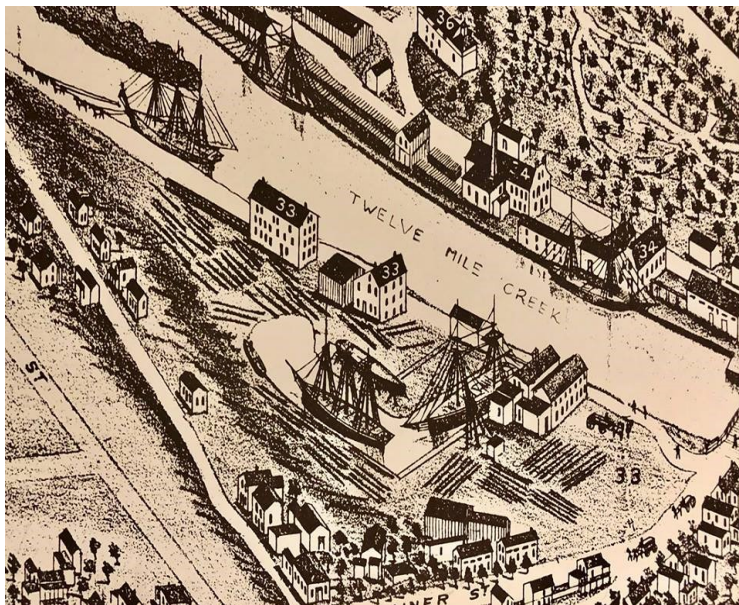

Just upstream from DYC, on the Twelve Mile Creek, there is an active archeological dig on the 19th century ship building site of Louis Shickluna. The investigation is being conducted by Brock professor, Dr. Kimberly Monk.

The site is down the hill from Rodman Hall, where the Fire Department's training building is located along the creek.

Digging just commenced this July 15th.



Louis Shickluna was a Master Shipbuilder.

Shickluna's ship yard was on the canal in St. Catharines from 1833 to 1892.

Over 140 schooners, barkentines, steamers and other vessels were built in his yards, primarily for use on the Great Lakes.

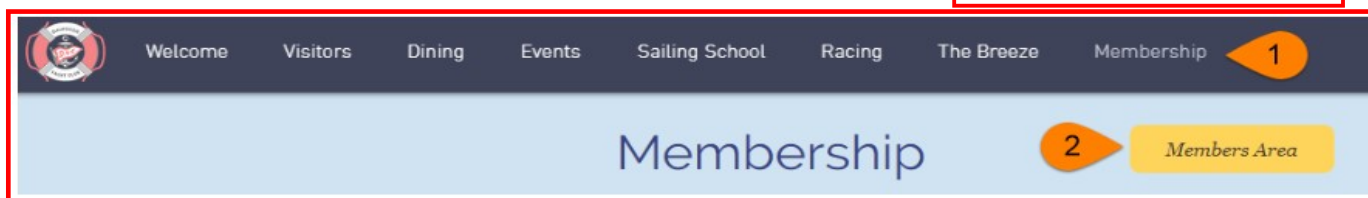


Greg and I have been working on the site over the past few months and here's a little walk-through of what's what. If you see something you would like to help improve either with new high quality images or written content, please let us know.

2. Login as a club member by clicking to the members area.

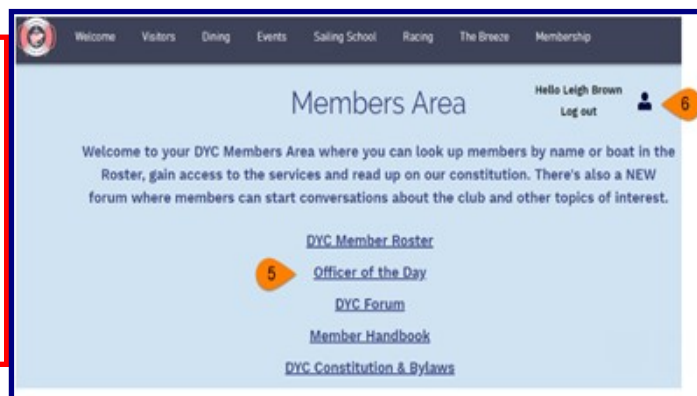

6. The NEW Member Icon lets you review your bookings (AKA Officer of the Day). Click on the Member ICON.

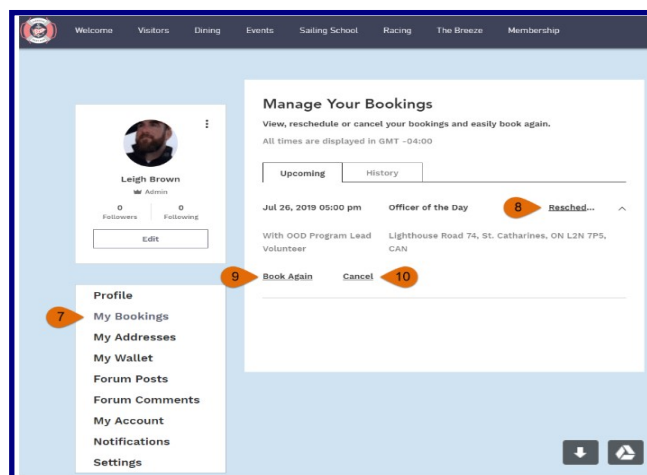


7. Here you will see your bookings or if you like navigate through other features, some are active forums.

10. If you aren't able to keep your booking then you can cancel it here.

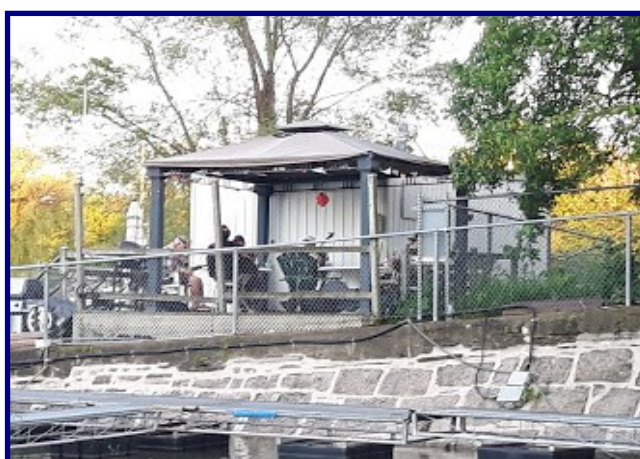

Fort Erie's Ultratones tuning up for reunion shows

'60s band shared stage with Sam the Sham and the Pharaohs

The Ultratones were just a group of Fort Erie teens who wanted to be in a band back in 1962.

"We started pre-Beatles," drummer John Johnston recalls. "It was pretty difficult. It was a big deal for us to play high school dances." Then WKBW Radio in Buffalo came calling. "They sent somebody over to listen. They wanted us to be on the KB Caravan. We ended up playing all over the Niagara Peninsula and into Hamilton."

The hookup with the radio station also led to a slot as the opening act by Sam the Sham and the Pharaohs, best known for their hit *Wooly Bully*. The group was a going concern until the four members — Johnston, Eugene Pilato (guitar), Dave Bellhouse (keyboards) and Al Hooper (bass) — went their separate ways to attend university.

It wasn't until 1988 that the four got back together for a one-off show to help raise money for the YMCA.

Now, they are doing it again. The Ultratones had a show lined up for July 9 at the Plaiice Bar & Grill in Fort Erie. The band played two sets that started at 7 p.m. They are also planning another show for the YMCA in September. The date and venue for that show are to be determined.

The group has been rehearsing weekly for the past year to get in shape for the shows. Johnston has kept his drumming chops up to snuff playing with Steve Burnside's band.

"The stuff we'll be playing is basically '60s stuff, the Beatles, Stones, CCR. Some '70s stuff like the Eagles." Johnston, for one, thinks the band is ready and people will be pleased. "We expect a big crowd."

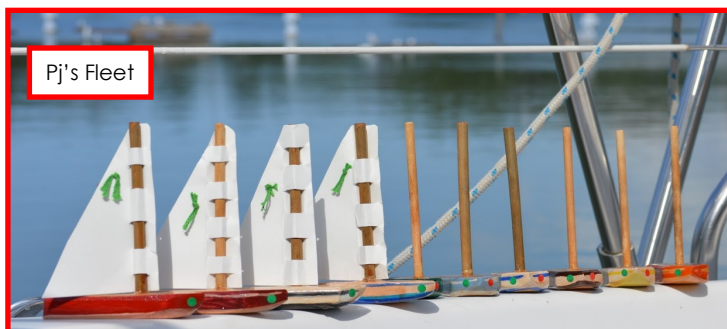

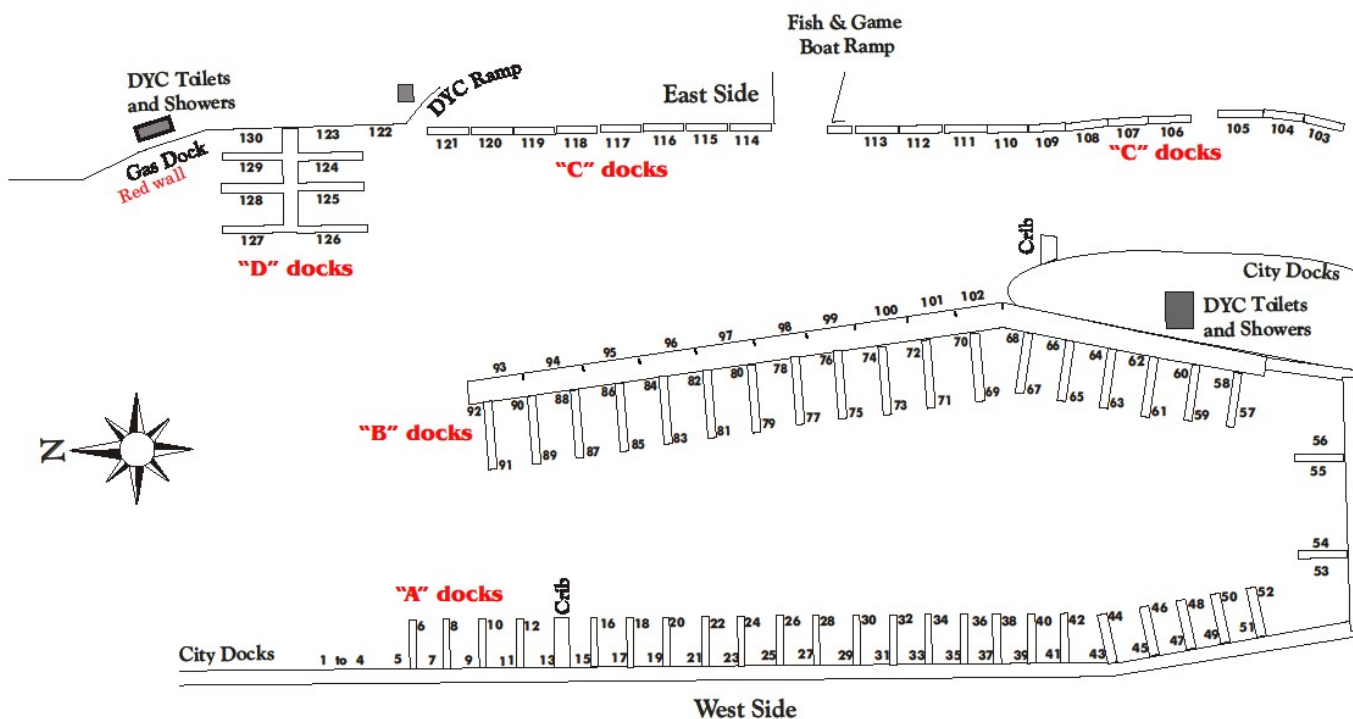
