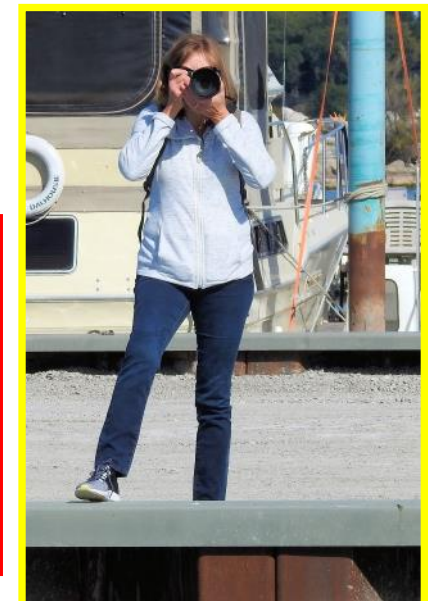

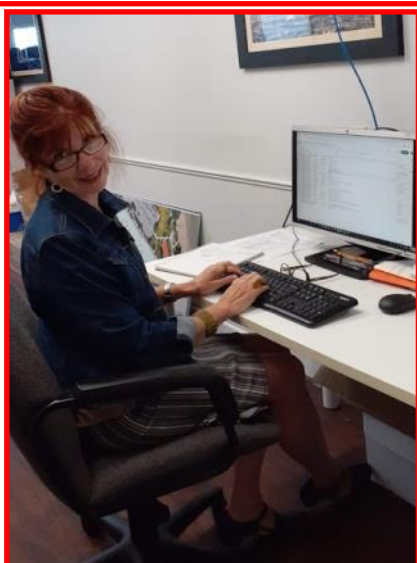

Safety Officer's Report . . . Safety is Personal

Well it's getting close to the end of the season. Boats out on 16 Oct; only 18 days to go as I am writing this thing. Just occurred to me why it is so difficult to get people to fill some positions at the Club - you have to look way ahead way earlier than most people do and consider the end. And the cost. And the risks. Yuck!

Wait. Didn't I say all this last year? OMG. Yes. I did.

Well, everything is exactly the same as it was at this time last year, right? So here goes.

There are basically two types of clubs – one, with volunteers doing most everything with a few 'hired hands', with 'guidelines' re procedures for lifting and dropping (oops - wrong word!) – lowering boats, fueling, pumping out, prepping the yards, mast raising and lowering etc, doing these things with whomever shows up, led by a more experienced volunteer/appointed person (but not always).

The other type does these tasks with teams of people who are identified well in advance, trained on task, outfitted in specialised safety gear (such as colour-coded hard hats), are expected to show up (and do) with their performance and safety on task monitored by an assigned supervisor. Still, almost all are volunteers. Often, no one who is not one of the 'teams' is even allowed in the yard, for any reason during boats in and out. Not even to get it ready or to clean it up after lift out. Some clubs actually issue fines to members who break these and other club rules and regulations.

Well over the past year there have been many changes and DYC has progressed to a more disciplined and orderly work method. Still, there are no guarantees that nothing will go wrong, regardless of the approach. And from personal experience, COVID is causing us to become more easily distracted and sorry to say, irritable. Remember, we are a team at DYC and need to work together carefully. And respectfully, too.

We have guidelines that must be enforced by you – the participant. Take the time to familiarize yourself with our guidelines, especially for the upcoming boats and docks out and the other major jobs such as prepping the travel lift and that work area that are underway.

No alcohol in use; from the Club or otherwise.

Pay attention to the task at hand. Listen to the Lead Hand in charge. Speak up if you see something wrong / or need to know something about what is happening. Stay on your specific task I.E. forward port side lifting cradle handler and don't wander about.

When on top of a boat (any boat), look before you drop the sling/lines over the side. There are friends and relatives down there (potentially).

Safety Officer's Report Cont'd

If you must depart, please advise the Lead Hand in advance so others can be brought in to replace you.

Hang around after your boat is out, if you can. We are always short of essential people, especially as the day wages on. The risks increase as people must multi-task.

And my personal favorite, always worth repeating – don't force us to handle too short taglines made up of multiple short lines tied together or worse, use those curly polypropylene things that snag on the fences. Always. Yes. Always.

And as always, safety is your job. Just do it!

Very Local History Matters . . .

The first mention of a DYC float in a parade is from the 1955 minutes, but the minutes book from Sep. 1948 to Aug. 1954 is missing. The picture is later than 1950, as the veranda and dining room addition are present.

Bellhouse thinks that the last DYC float was entered in the 1972 Grape Festival Parade.



Next page ~ The work party is laying the track down to our permanent 12 ton derrick, visible to the left of the work party. Boats were moved to and from storage on a cart with train wheels. Storage was on 2 sets of skids parallel to the channel. (About where the main parking lot is today.)

This was the usual mode of hauling out, complemented by a mobile crane for the larger boats. The derrick failed in 1975. Since then mobile cranes have been used for all boats. The new era will be the Pressley/Jack Travel Lift.

The boats in the last two pictures (below and the next page) were lifted and stored on the marine railway system.

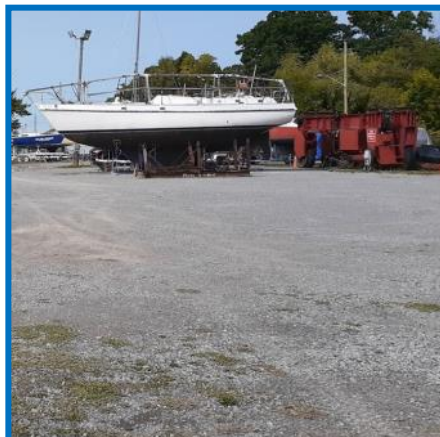
Bellhouse's answer to my request to date the cars.

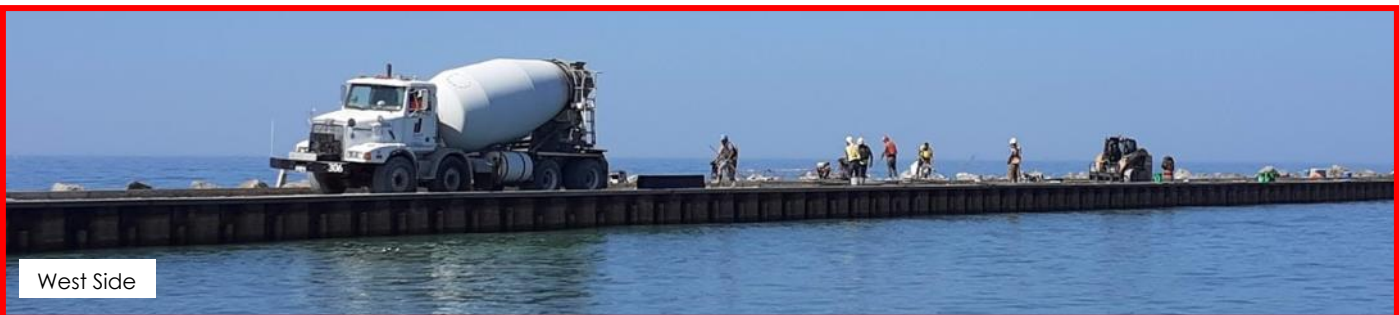

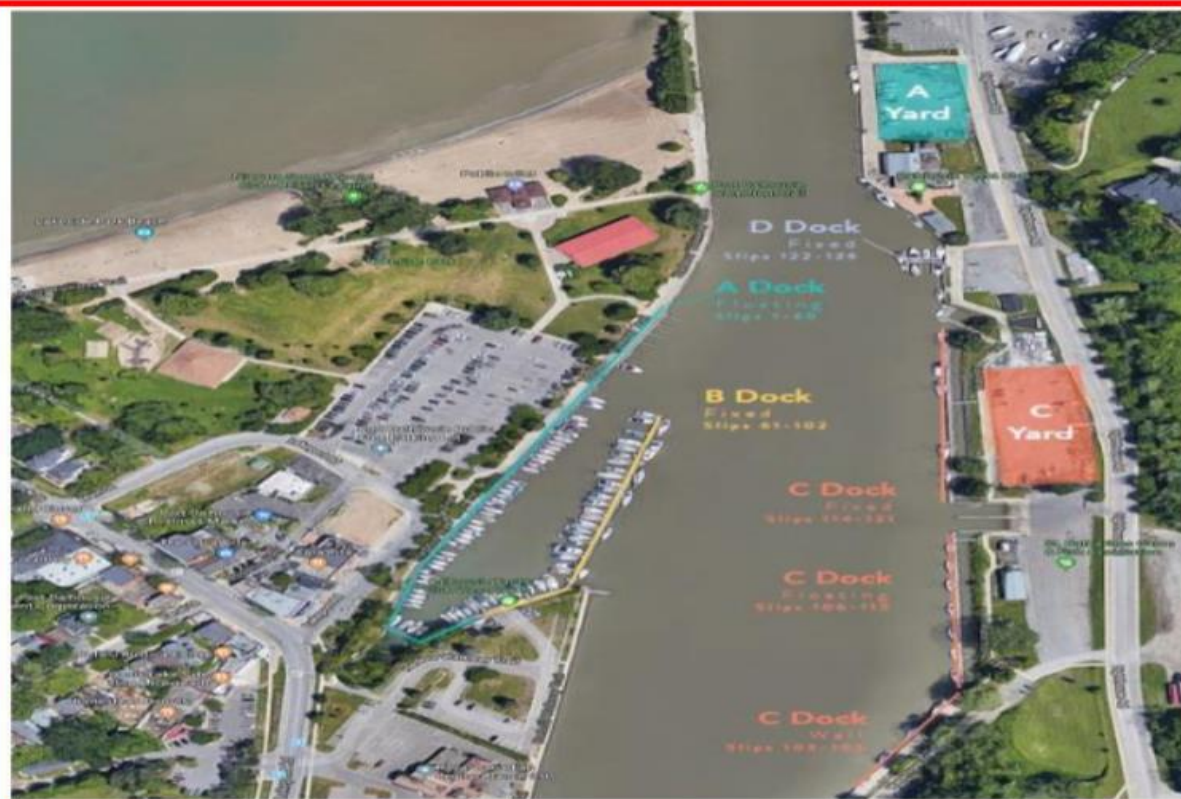

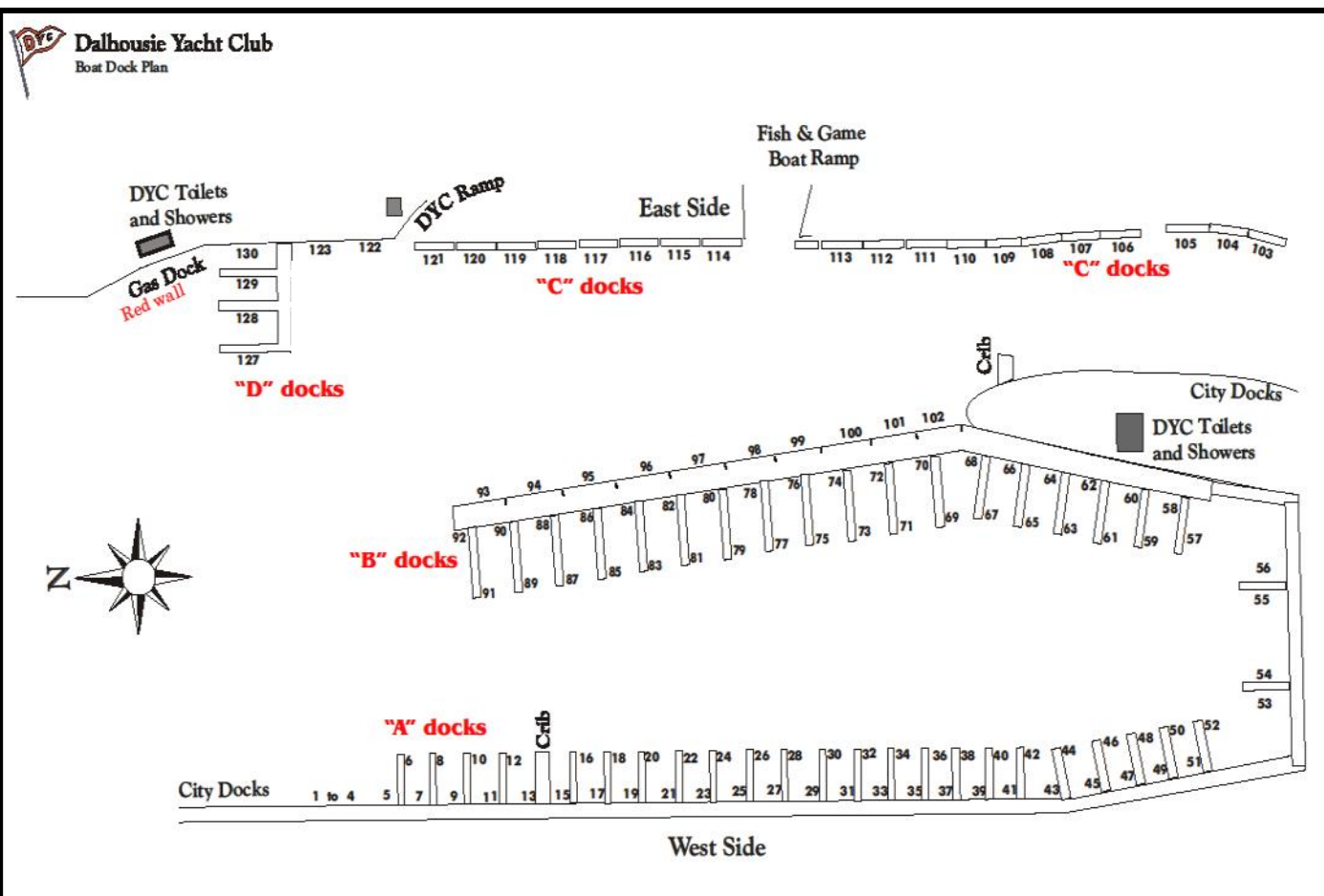
