New On-line Roster ...

This month The Breeze spotlights the club online roster. We ask that our members login, confirm their contact info and perhaps upload a photo of themselves. Here are the steps.



1. **Log in** <https://www.dalhousieyachtclub.com/members>

If it is your first time logging in, you will be prompted to signup with an email address and password. We will verify that you are a member and approve your account within 24 hours. (Usually we are able to do it within a few moments so long as you sign up with the same address we have on file for you.)

2. **Search the Roster** - Once approved, you will be able to search the DYC membership roster by name, email or boat name.



3. **Edit My Profile** - This is where you can confirm your information (phone numbers, email addresses and more)
4. **Add a profile picture** - Pick an image from your phone or computer
5. **Upload** the Image by clicking Upload
6. **Save** all your changes

Hi all,

I have quite a bit to report this month ...

1. The staff report for the Legion Condo Development was presented to City Council on June 11th and it seemed to cause quite a stir around the club. The staff report is an outline of the project and contains recommendations to city council to allow them to make educated decisions regarding the future site plans to be developed by Rankin construction. I have contacted Amanda Knustson, the city planner involved with the project, and have been assured that no site plan has yet been finalized and DYC will be instrumental in the future planning process. Paul Haynes and myself will remain in contact with Rankin Construction and the City of St. Catharines to assure we get the best outcome for DYC. Following is the proposed site plan from the city planners to get an idea of their vision. But, to reconfirm, this is just a proposal. Nothing has been decided as of yet.
2. LTS is looking amazing again this year with 55 kids already signed up, including 28 for the first session. Three instructors have been hired for the season and two have been at the club, volunteering to get boats and the building ready. The yard will still need a good clean up and the LTS dock repairs will be finished Canada Day weekend. Volunteers will be welcomed this Friday and Saturday.
3. Adult sailing lessons will be starting July 10th and will again be running Tuesdays and Thursdays. Please let your friends know. Visit the club website for information and to register

CANSail Start Keelboat Sailing Course

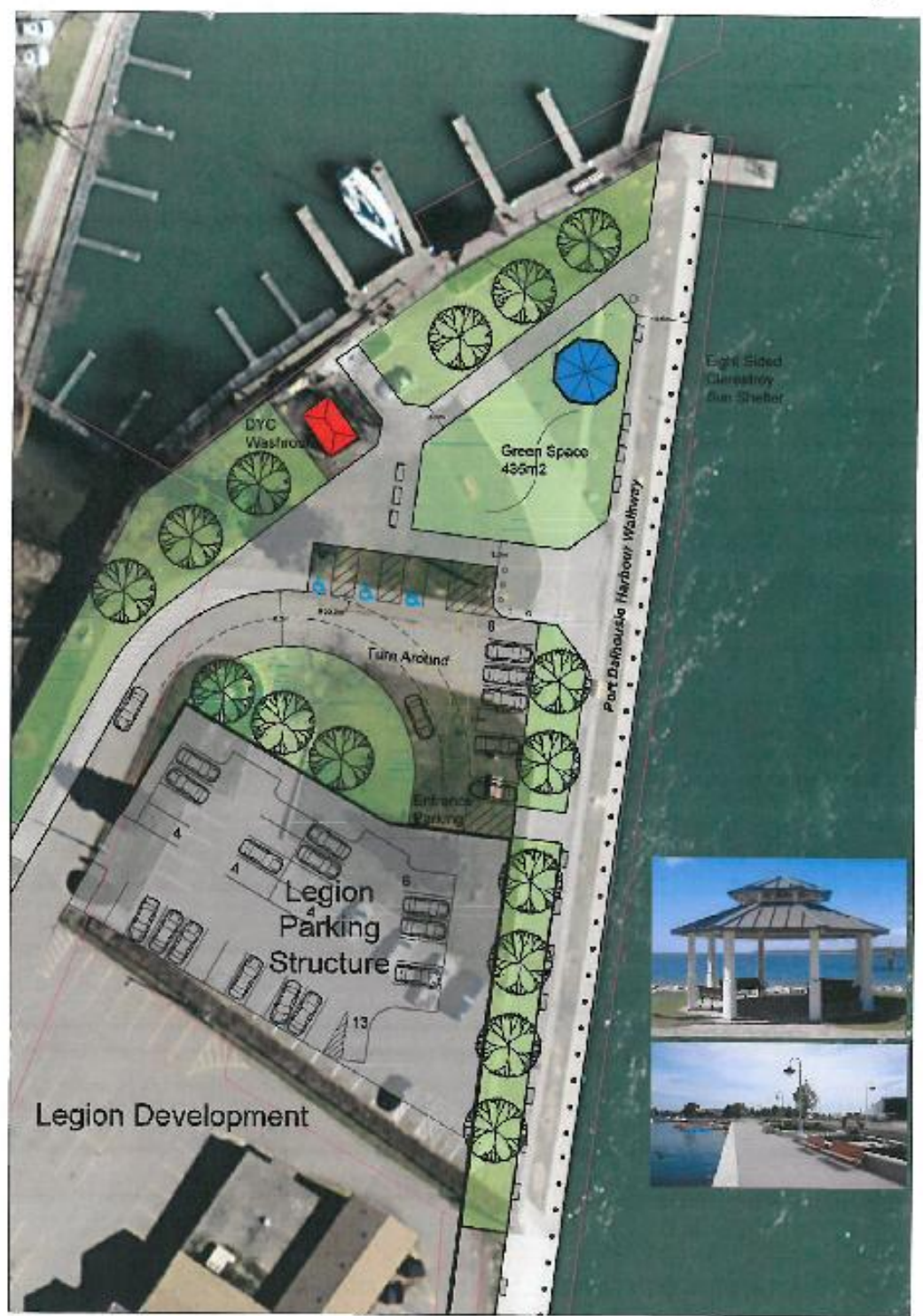
Tuesday and Thursday Evenings 5:30 pm to 9:00 pm.

This is one of the entry levels in the series of Sail Canada courses on sailing keelboats and on Cruising. This course is the recommended starting point for individuals with minimal practical on water experience. This entry level course builds basic sailing skills with a focus on operation of the vessel as crew. Candidates completing this course will be able to competently contribute as crew to the operation of a keelboat in moderate daytime conditions. This standard is recommended for those with little boating or sailing experience that want to experience sailing on a keelboat and begin to build basic sailing skills in a relaxed environment and at a comfortable pace.

Treasurer's Report ...

There are two months to go in DYC's fiscal year (August 31st is the fiscal year end to 2018 and the beginning of fiscal 2019), which means it is time to begin thinking about budgeting, membership fees, expenses and projects.

This year has seen tremendous activity around the club - on the docks, east side washrooms, the new entertainment centre in the old lock and the newly approved condo development to the south on the west side. These are all opportunities for DYC to grasp opportunities for new memberships and opportunities to continue to improve.

The board has been increasing its use of technology. And, before you tell me about it, I know, I know, our WiFi sucks. But on other fronts we are making progress. This year you will be asked in advance of invoicing to check your information in the member database and to let us know your intentions, i.e., will you be renewing membership? This is important for our planning and to avoid incorrect invoices. Invoices are expensive to issue and doubly so to issue adjustments. In other clubs, members are asked to submit resignations by a certain date to avoid

penalties. DYC does not do this. However, we do need to know member intentions.

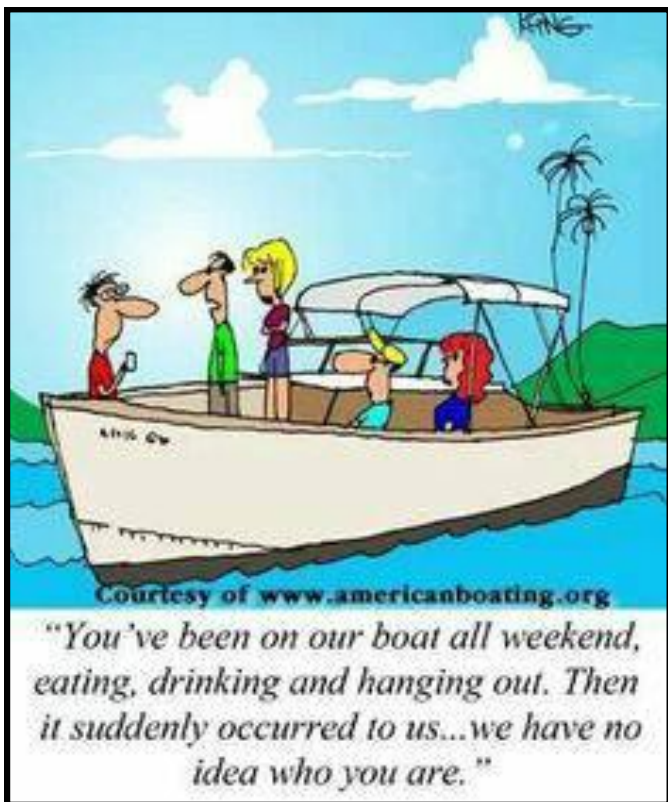
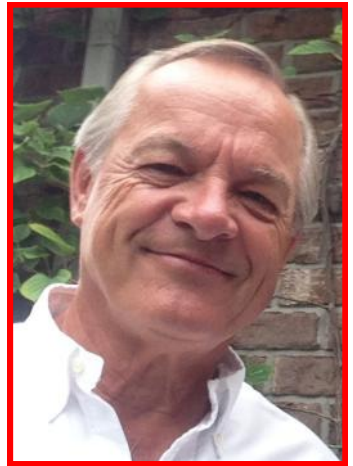
I wonder how often members think about DYC not just as a social and recreational place but also as a Not-For-Profit business entity. DYC has all the requirements of record keeping, payroll, operating expenses, cashflow, asset maintenance, and the future to consider. Dan Sundy has a saying, "History Matters," a saying that leads us to consider the legacy entrusted to us and, therefore, to the question, "What's our contribution to new and future members?" We are not just here to enjoy the locale: we have a responsibility to sustain and improve.

While DYC is a NFP Corporation, it is also effectively a cooperative. Members have the right to a say in how it operates, sets its fees and its policies. They also have a responsibility to contribute. A good number of members look around, see something that needs attention, and attend to it. Others have regularly and year after year looked after an aspect of DYC that creates a sense of a well-tended place (flowerpots around the clubhouse for example, thanks to Diane and Allen Baird). I wonder how many members appreciate the myriad of tasks routinely undertaken by other members, silently and loyally attending to needs around the club? There is much more to be done.

Financially, revenues and expenses are relatively in balance. Revenues are roughly on par with the last year but still below two years prior. The insurance funds are helping. However, we will need to tap into capital reserves funds to pay for some of the electrical work.

Barring the unseen, I believe we should be able to set 2019 fees at roughly nominal inflation rates. The board will be reviewing these fees at the July board meeting. So, let us know your thoughts.

To get to this forum topic:


1. Click on the **Membership** tab





Shell Ethanol-free fuel coming to the DYC Gas Dock in July!

Does your boat motor have a problem with alcohol? That is, the alcohol blended into gasoline called ethanol.

Ethanol gasoline may be suitable for car engines, but it can damage fuel systems of boat motors and other small engines. Ethanol can ruin fuel lines or clog carburetors if it sits in the motor for prolonged periods.

In boat fuel systems, ethanol can cause harm. A solvent, it's corrosive to rubber and plastic. Ethanol absorbs water and, after long periods in the tank, will separate into water and ethanol.

Problems arise because boat motors average relatively few days of running each year.

“This infrequent usage leads to fuel being stored for extended periods, increasing the opportunity for it to absorb moisture,” according to BoatUS, a boat owners’ group. “This not only makes the fuel unusable (and) once drawn into the engine, the fuel can severely damage the engine.”

Beginning this month, the DYC fuel dock will be selling Shell Ethanol-free fuel. Spread the word!



DOF Conducts Electrofishing Study ...

Members may have noticed a team from the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada electrofishing at the Port Dalhousie Piers late at night, into the early morning hours, earlier in June.

The practice is a scientific survey method in which officials from the DOF Great Lakes Laboratory for Fisheries and Aquatic Sciences pass electrical currents through electrodes partially submerged in the water, bringing the fish to the surface where they may be scooped up in nets.

Teams were looking for the American Eel, a species at risk.

Those fish found were tagged with transmitters and were released near the Welland Canal or the Niagara River. Receivers placed near the Port Dalhousie pier will help determine if the fish return to the area.

The study is being conducted in advance of pier repairs.
