

Taller & Straighter, B dock will be the dock of choice for many years to come. Commendations to all the work and supporting crews who have achieved these excellent results.

Challenges surround DYC -all surmountable with willing hands. Consider the founding members in 1937. They were starting what we enjoy today. DYC is first & foremost a self-help club. B dock renovation is the current example of what can be done well and at low cost -the result of volunteer labour. Call or email me if you are looking to contribute. I can point you to tasks and directors who can use your skills.

So far this year the club has installed new furnaces and re-roofed a significant part of the clubhouse. Painting, assisting Learn-to-Sail, Beautification, and other tasks are still need volunteers. Lets all do our part to change the 80/20 rule of thumb to 100/100.

Commendations to Chris Essig and Jim White who have agreed to act as co-fleet directors to ensure club boats are adequately maintained and equipped.

Dry Sail Launch -we are anticipating that concrete pouring and the Dry Sail hoist will not be ready for May 1st. Therefore, the Board has agreed to launch and provide a temporary slip (at no additional cost) for Dry Sail members in good standing, ie paid up. This is a contingency measure as we anticipate weather delays will impede Bronte Construction from pouring concrete and re-installing the hoist until late May or early June. The club wants everyone sailing.


Dock requests & dock deposits are due by the end of February & DYC is committed to a launch date of May 1st.





The Sailing School dinghies are all stored and the snow is flying. In spite of the cold, the Sailing School Committee is hard at work planning our upcoming season. We have interviewed fantastic instructor candidates and it looks like we may be able to offer not only CANsail 1-4 but also possibly CANsail 5 to our students. This is very exciting because it means the level of sailing and racing amongst our students is becoming more advanced. DYC was begun in 1937. Some founders and early members were continuously involved in the club for decades. To acknowledge their commitment, a new membership category was created in 1961

Motion: from minutes in 1961 "That a member who has attained twenty-five 25 years as a member in good standing becomes a lifetime paid up member with voting and other privileges thereto."

As indicated in the above motion, in addition to the prestige, there was a financial benefit, of waiving the membership dues, for life. (Dockage and storage fees still applied.)

The criteria for Life designation has changed over the years. Various requirements of age, years of membership, docking at DYC and service on the board have been factors. The current criteria shown at the end of this article was instituted in 2010.

As more members met the requirements for Life status, the percentage of members not paying membership fees was affecting the club's finances. (Life members approached 20%) Any financial benefit relating to dues was discontinued in 2007. Currently, the only financial benefit is exemption from the monthly minimums in the dining room.

Life Membership – Regulations (2010)

A member must meet the following criteria to be considered for Life Membership:

A member must reach the age of 65 years and accumulate 60 points.

Points are awarded as follows:

- 1 point for each year as a Boating member
- 1 point for each year docking at DYC
- 1 point for each year serving as a non-flag Director
- 2 points for each year serving as a Flag Officer

If your name is not on the list below and you qualify for Life designation, or you notice the absence of some qualified member, then contact Dan Sundy or the office.




News from Brenda and Paul



Safety Officer's Report . . . Safety is Personal

Safety Instructions for Novice Sailors (but not powerboaters)

January Safety Officer Submission

Well, now that things have quieted down, I find I have nothing to say.

Oops. Safety is always an issue and there is always something to say.

It came as a surprise to me upon assuming this job (aka task) to find that DYC was subject to the Ontario Health and Safety Act (OHSA) and in addition, was required to comply with standards and procedures of a number of organisations such as the Ontario Sailing Association in order to maintain membership therein to have the ability to instruct new sailors and issue certificates indicating a level of competence.

I had just assumed that Clubs were Clubs – self-regulating, self-governing, private organisations. No.

OHSA compliance requires that DYC treat the facilities, any hired staff (temporary or permanent) and contractors visiting and working on the premises the same as would any business or organisation with employees, serving the public (or not). And by extension this requirement applies to you: the membership and our guests at DYC. Compliance requires that OHSA guidelines and policies be put in place for workplace health and safety, a job big enough that in an organisation of even relatively small size, requires the appointment of a full-time Safety Person and often the setting up of a Safety Committee. By now I am sure that most of us are involved (or have been) in one way or another in this type of thing. The Safety Person is responsible to implement OHSA policies and procedures including sometimes the giving of instruction on workplace issues (material hazards, work hazards, inspection requirements, etc) and also the documentation of someone having done these things. These compliance requirements are being met at DYC. Special care is being taken with the Learn to Sail Program to teach the instructors and the Dockside Fueling Area workers OHSA requirements for issues such as workplace violence and harassment, and health and safety procedures, particularly since they are DYC's 'first responders', to our learners who are often youngish children in their care on the docks for the entire day, and in the case of the refuelling area, people who may not be paying attention or unaware of safety procedures and requirements.

As I have often said (too many times?) – Safety is personal.

What does that have to do with OHSA?

Well, I am quite familiar with plans, policies and procedures, having written a few in my work life. Rules, regulations and procedures hanging on the hallway bulletin board, in the lunch room, the washrooms, the shop or yard do nothing but meet a requirement. They cannot act. It is up to the individuals to inform themselves of these things and then, when the situation requires, to act.

That is where you step in. Read the documentation hanging on various DYC walls. The Fire Plan? The Spill Procedures? Etc. And most importantly, when required, act.

Safety is personal. There. I said it again.


