

Commodore's Report ...

As my final days of being Commodore gradually close, I reflect back on the last two years as a very rewarding experience for me. I have made many great new connections and shared a lot of laughs.

My first year as Commodore started with B-Dock repair headed up by Tom Schulz and dock gang, bringing the successful repair in at a record low cost and many thanks to all who contributed to that great project.

The 2016 sailing season was incredible with almost 150 days of perfect boating weather. However, the 2017 season was much different with terribly high water, too much wind and less than 100 days of decent boating weather. We finally launched C-Yard on June 9th and A-Yard at the end of June. I would like thank the membership for sticking it out as a



group to ensure our doors remained open. A big thanks to Edward and his staff in the kitchen who never once complained to me about the slow start and missing two months of usually very busy Wednesday night racing crowds. But instead Edward took it on himself to create specials, including a free BBQ in order to keep moral alive during a very difficult time.

On the brighter side, LTS had the highest enrollment in many years and thanks to Jason Smyth. Also thanks to Tom Lynam for creating the new website and to Brenda Hazlewood for keeping us all connected with the famous Breeze. The new pier construction project gave DYC a new facelift at the fuel dock complete with fender boards, a concrete walkway, a patio and a renovated Harbour Office.

The new above ground fuel system is a capital investment that will last many years to come and, combined with a new lease valid till 2022, this puts DYC on a new solid foundation. New D-Dock construction is underway replacing the existing docks. Thanks to the dock committee for their continued commitment to upgrades at DYC. The new D-dock will be located 20 feet south of the existing dock, giving more swing room for boats leaving the fuel dock. Once completed, DYC will have a great new frontage appearance at the club.



We have a new flag and board in place and I support and wish Simon Krall and his board much success moving forward. Simon and the board have many challenges ahead so please support this team as its takes a lot of time and effort to run the club.

DYC is a great club filled with great people at an awesome location. Please remember that. I have probably missed many other projects and volunteers in my final report, so thanks to all who volunteered during my two years as Commodore.

Freasurer's Report ...

In case you missed the AGM, John Brown has extra copies through generous member of the Grant Thornton Review Engagement report. The following is a précis of my presentation.

DYC survived an extraordinary year. Between the surprise \$24,000 primarily due to work of having to remove the old underground fuel tanks and the retrofit of D dock, and the flooding of DYC buildings and docks, the resulting upset could have damaged the club far more than it did. The club incurred about \$80,000 in extraordinary expense and suffered some loss of fuel sales and dock fees. As well, we may have other infrastructure issues which we have begun to review with our insurers. DYC carries insurance for both business interruption and losses due to the flooding.

We were fortunate that we had had a few good years and had built up reserves of \$60,000 for docks and about \$30,000 of operating reserves. Of the \$80, 000, \$20,000 was paid out of the Dock Reserve fund, and the balance out of operating reserves. The good news in this is that the investments in new fuel storage and D dock have a 30 -40 year life.

While we had some cash on hand at year end, we also owed suppliers about \$107,000. We had an operating shortfall; however, some suppliers have been patient in waiting for payment. This is a situation that DYC can manage; however, we need to be careful in spending through the next few years in order to rebuild reserves. And getting the few delinquent members to pay promptly will also help a great deal.


The good news story is that DYC is in an idyllic location and can attract new members, more boats and more visitors. LTS has been doing quite well for the past two years and this activity helps attract new members.

The key pages in the Review Engagement Report are; Pg 2 - The Balance Sheet, Pg 3 - Income and Expense Statement, and Pg 10 - Detailed Expenditures.

On the Balance Sheet, while we have \$90,000 in operating cash we also owe suppliers \$107,000. DYC is continuing to contact delinquent members in order to bring their accounts into good standing. The Dock Reserve still contains \$40,000 after paying out \$20,000 for the pilings work. Some additional money will be required to build the docks and fingers. Here DYC saves a lot of money

volunteer labour.

Income was down about fewer boats in slips. Member dues and dock fees represent about 63% of club revenues so it is important that we work at attracting new members. LTS and Res-



taurant revenues were up this year too.

Key expenditures; yard and LHO \$41,700, this is 11% of revenues, offset by LHO and storage revenues of \$58,600. Taxes and Lease, \$54,250 represents 15% of revenues. Hydro at \$23,800 is 2% of revenues.

All in all it was not a great year, but it could have been worse, and going forward I believe DYC is well positioned.

Finally, I announced that this will be my last year as treasurer. It has been an interesting challenge and a new treasurer will find much to do that will help the club to be more efficient. I would like to hear from members who are interested in the post and in becoming a member of a finance committee to work with me during the year. It is a lot easier to move in as treasurer with an awareness of systems and policies.

I am pleased with the transitions to a new bookkeeper and our new banking relationship with Meridian Credit Union where we have lower account fees and earn interest on savings. I am also very pleased that Leigh Brown and Val Jack are helping the club to improve the membership database and the quality of DYC invoices. The target is to roll out the new record keeping and invoicing system in time for the Spring dock invoicing.




Haul Out 2017 ...




